

GUESS-A-SKETCH 2020 VIRTUAL RULES

HOW TEAMS PLAY:

The name of the game is Guess-A-Sketch and the general idea is architectural Pictionary.

There will be three total rounds of the game.

Teams have been divided into four groups of two to start, with one team captain for each team.

Please note that teams will not be able to communicate within the Zoom application. We suggest setting up a separate channel to communicate with your team. This could include a text message thread, Google Chat, Slack, etc.

For each round, 2 of our 4 sketchers will be sketching different historically significant architectural works. Teams will be guessing the name of the building based on these two sketches in two minutes or less. To signal that you would like to guess, the team captain will lift a brightly colored card with their firm name on it. When called upon by the emcee, the team captain will say their answer!

Each team will compete in Round 1 and will have up to five opportunities to guess and win. The first four teams to **correctly guess three plays** will advance to the next round. This is a single elimination game, so every guess counts!

As a last reminder, we want a clean game – so please follow the honesty policy and refrain from googling the answer! Attendees should also pay close attention; if the call is too close, we will be polling our audience to vote which team has the correct answer!

How the Audience Plays:

Audience members can also play along by guessing **your guesses in the chat with #guessasketch and the correct answer!** There are great prizes for the first correct guesser on every single play.

If yours is the first correct guess, @CenterforArch will re-chat your winning guess. After the event, please email development@aiany.org to claim your winnings. All prizes will be available for pick up.

We have some awesome prizes this year, so listen up at the beginning of each round to find out what you can win. (Individual audience members are limited to just **3 prizes for the evening**, so give someone else a chance to guess and win!)
